Get to Know Craig Riedel: State Representative

Kasich Names Conway and Friedeman to PUCO

Governor John Kasich announced his appointment of Daniel Conway and Lawrence Friedeman to the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. Both were among five finalized for the two vacant seats. Energy attorney Daniel Conway will replace current commissioner Lynn Slaby and Lawrence Friedeman, IGS Energy Vice President, will replace Howard Petricoff.

Motter Calls for Increased Transparency

Miranda Motter, the president and CEO of the Ohio Association of Health Plans, testified before a House panel on the Affordable Care Act that the OAHP wants to increase transparency so Ohioans have more information about the cost of the medical services they are obtaining. Motter added efforts should be made to identify key cost drivers, including medical service rates and prescription costs.

Comment Period Open on ESSA

State Superintendent of Public Instruction Paolo DeMaria presented a draft of the state's response to the federal Every Student Succeeds Act to the Joint Education Oversight Committee on Thursday. Currently, the ESSA plan is open for a public comment period and is expected to be submitted in April.
